

Kent Playing Fields Association is a registered Charity, formed in 1926, initially to get the youngsters off the streets and onto playing fields and playgrounds. We then gave grants and loans to local councils to help purchase parcels of land and help with the layout, drainage, etc. We still do that today. Sports clubs were then offered low interest loans for capital projects, as they are today. In addition, we have established three memorial funds which give grants to help both individuals and group projects. Over the years the KCPFA has built up a revolving fund by careful and cautious management from which we provide the grants, loans, and all other assistance above, but funds are limited.

The Cecil Leitch Competition is the only fund raising event staged by the KCPFA.
